New meal prices are effective July 1:

- ❖ Secondary breakfast \$1.75
- ❖ Adult lunch w/o milk \$3.00
- ❖ Adult lunch w/milk \$3.35

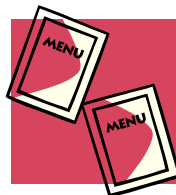
Nutrition Services has replaced its Online Payment website. Please go to www.schoolpaymentsolutions.com.

The "Greening" of Nutrition Services *Paperless Menu Starts June 1*

Beginning June 1, parents and students will have one less piece of paper to sort out in the weekly folder. Nutrition Services continues to reduce its carbon footprint with a Paperless Menu. Policy on Charging Meals

Begins July 1

Nutrition Services takes seriously the responsibility to remain fiscally healthy so the parents and students of DCSD can depend on having nutritious meals every school day. To do so, we ask parents to follow our policy on charging meals.

For elementary students, only two charged meals are allowed. After this, if the student's lunch is not paid for, the student will be provided a meal of fruits, vegetables, and milk. At this point, families will receive a note as a reminder to place more funds into the student's lunch account. Students will be provided the alternate lunch three times.

NOTE: If the student does not have funds in the lunch account after three alternate lunches, then the student will not be allowed to eat the lunch provided by the cafeteria. The parent may send lunch with the student. Elementary students are not allowed to charge ala carte food items if the lunch account does not have enough funds to cover the cost of the item. Secondary students are not allowed to charge meals or ala carte food items.
