

Format for Citing Sources

Book

Guideline: Author(s): last name, first. Title of book underlined. City of publication: Publisher, Copyright date.

Example: Forest, Nancy, and Robert Johnson. Walking with Dinosaurs. Denver: Three Eagles Press, 1968.

Encyclopedia

Guideline: Author: last name, first. "Title of article." Name of encyclopedia, Publishing date.

Example: Smith, Jonathan. "Mound Builders." World Book Encyclopedia, 1990 ed.

Note: When there is no author, begin citation with title of article.

Specialized Encyclopedia

Guideline: Author: last name, first. "Title of article." Name of encyclopedia. City of publication: Publisher, Copyright date.

Example: Weldon, Ward. "Starfish." International Wildlife Encyclopedia. New York: Marshall Cavendish, 1990.

Note: When there is no author, begin citation with title of article.

Periodical

Guideline: Author: last name, first. "Title of article." Title of magazine underlined, Date of magazine: Page(s) used.

Example: Gibbs, Nancy R. "Germany Today." Time Magazine. 29 Aug. 1994: 28-32.

General Web Site

Guideline: "Title of article." Name of organization sponsoring Web site (if available). Date material is accessed <Electronic address> (or URL)

Example: "Destination Mexico: Culture." Lonely Planet. 14 April 2005.

CD-ROM

Guideline: Author: last name, first. "Title of article." Name of encyclopedia. CD-ROM. Name of vendor, Date of electronic publication.

Example: Webber, Andrew. "Folk Music." Encarta Encyclopedia Deluxe. CD-ROM. Microsoft, 2002.

Encyclopedia Online

Guideline: Author: last name, first. "Title of article." Name of encyclopedia Online. Date material is accessed <Electronic address> (or URL).

Example: Pasachoff, Jay. "Planet." World Book Online. 19 April 2005.
